

NAIT INFORMATION SYSTEM ACCESS PANEL ANNUAL REPORT 2018





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INTRODUCTION

This Annual Report of the NAIT Information System Access Panel (*Panel*) is provided in accordance with regulation 8 of the National Animal and Tracing (Information System Access Panel) Regulations 2012 (*Regulations*). It reports on the year ended 30 June 2018.

NAIT PROGRAMME

OSPRI's National Animal Identification and Tracing (*NAIT*) programme operates under the National Animal Identification and Tracing Act 2012 (*Act*). It is an industry and Government initiative that links people, property and agreed classes of livestock in New Zealand.

Cattle and deer are traced using NAIT-approved RFID ear tags. Once tagged, each animal is registered in a national database and the details recorded include:

- the animal's location
- · movement during the animal's life, and
- contact details for the person in charge of that animal.

NAIT data is captured for a wide range of reasons to benefit industry, government and New Zealand including:

- · improve biosecurity management
- food safety
- · market access
- human health
- · animal productivity
- · natural disasters
- policy development, and
- · lifetime traceability of animals.

The Act provides a comprehensive regime for the management of the data collected by NAIT to ensure that NAIT data is available for these purposes, whilst protecting the privacy of the individuals and organisations that contribute to this dataset¹.

INFORMATION SYSTEM ACCESS PANEL

The Panel was established by regulation 4(1) of the Regulations and has the functions, duties and powers set out in regulation 7 of the Regulations.

The members of the Panel are appointed by NAIT Limited pursuant to regulation 4 of the Regulations.

The NAIT information System Administrator is required to be appointed by NAIT pursuant to section 39(2) of the Act. The role of the System Administrator is to manage access to the NAIT information system.

During the year to 30 June 2018, the System Administrator was:

Applications by third parties to be provided with data captured by NAIT are referred to the Panel or the System Administrator who are empowered by the Act to authorise disclosure of such data if certain statutory pre-requisites are met.

APPLICATIONS

During the year the Panel held three meetings. The Panel maintains a register of

member interests and a conflict of interests' policy. It regulates its own procedures.

In the year ended 30 June 2018 27 applications were received for access to NAIT data. Two applications were referred to the Panel. Three applications are awaiting further information from the applicant.

The remaining 20 applications were determined by the System Administrator.

Table 1 sets out the details relating to the 25 applications received.

NO COMPLAINTS OR BREACHES

There were no complaints received during the reporting period. There were no known breaches of conditions during the reporting period.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATION DECISIONS SINCE 2012

The number of applications for access to NAIT has varied over the past 6 years (see Figure 1). Over 80% of applications have been granted, with the exception of 2013/14 when several applications for information relating to stock theft were declined.

Figure 1 summarises applications considered since NAIT's establishment in July 2012.

FIGURE 1:NAIT DATA ACCESS DECISIONS SINCE 2012



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TABLE 2: CONDITIONS

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- Access to NAIT core data that is not personal information must not be provided until the System Administrator
 - (A) is satisfied (by production to the System Administrator of an express written PICA consent) that the applicant has express consent from the relevant PICA (as required by section 46(4)(a) of the NAIT Act) to the applicant being provided with the personal information about that PICA to which the applicant seeks access,
 - (B) has received, and granted formal approval under section 46(4)(a) in respect of, an application for access to the relevant PICA core data that is personal information
- ii. The System Administrator must be satisfied that a PICA may withdraw its consent by written notice to the System Administrator
- iii. Access to NAIT core data that is not personal information must not be provided until:
 - (A) NAIT and the applicant have entered into an agreement (under s41 of the NAIT Act) in respect of non-core data that is relevant to the applicant's project; and
 - (B) the System Administrator has received, and granted formal approval under s46(13) in respect of, an application for access to the relevant PICA non-core data held by NAIT under that agreement
- iv. Access to NAIT core data that is not personal information must not be provided until NAIT and the applicant have entered into an agreement (under s41 of the NAIT Act) in respect of non-core data that is relevant to the applicant's project and the relevant non-core data is available to the applicant under that agreement
- v. NAIT system must record each time core data (both personal information and not personal information) data is provided to the applicant's directors or staff and NAIT Ltd staff pursuant to this determination.
- vi. OSPRI to provide the NAIT System Administrator with a monthly report on AngusPure and OSPRI access to core data and non-core data pursuant to this determination.
- vii. OSPRI to provide to NAIT System Administrator promptly on request such other information about access to core data and non-core data pursuant to this determination as the System Administrator reasonably may request.
- viii. A review of the operation of this determination is to be undertaken by the NAIT Information System Administrator on or about 1 September each year.

- Access to this data must not be provided to any other person or organisation without that person or organisation successfully applying to NAIT for access to the NAIT number enquiry function.
- Use of this data must only be used to facilitate people ordering tags for use in the NAIT scheme.
- 3. Access is granted indefinitely, but will be removed for:
 - · Misuse of function
 - Non-compliance with the NAIT Device Standards for Cattle and Deer

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The data must only be to notify all PICAs of their obligations under the NAIT Act and highlight the importance of preventing disease spread.

The data must not be provided to any other person other than for the purpose of preparing and posting letters.

The data must be deleted once the notifications have been sent.

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- All requests for data to be lodged with NAIT Operations with a copy to the System Administrator.
- 2. All requests for data are to quote Application Number 299.
- 3. NAIT Operations to maintain a log of all requests received relating to this determination.
- 4. Data is only to be used for the purpose specified in this determination.
- 5. A review of the operation of this determination is to be undertaken by the NAIT Information System Administrator on or about 31 March each year.
